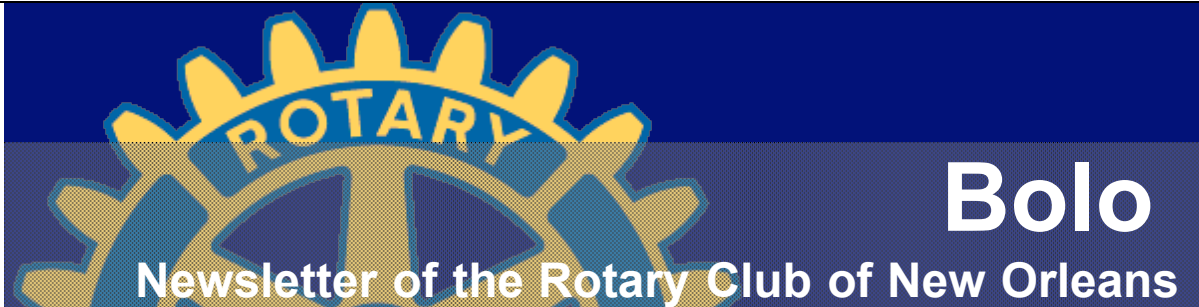

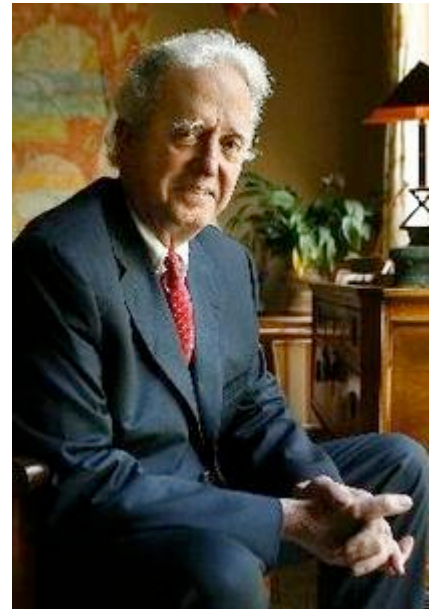

R. King Milling served as the President of Whitney Holding Corp. and its subsidiary, Whitney National Bank from 1984 to March 2007. Mr. Milling serves as Vice Chairman of Whitney National Bank. He served as Vice Chairman of Whitney Holding Corp. since March 2007 until March 31, 2008. He has been a Director of Whitney Holding Corp. and Whitney National Bank since 1978. He also serves as a Trustee of Dillard University and has a keen interest and devotion to restoring Louisiana's coastal wetlands.



King is the Chairman of the Governor's Advisory Committee on Coastal Restoration and Conservation, America's Wetland Foundation, and the Committee of the Future of Coastal Louisiana. He is a board member of five other coast-related organizations.

Once Milling started getting involved, he said, he couldn't stop. "It took on a life of its own," he said. "You end up grabbing the alligator by the tail, and you can't let him go because he'll bite the devil out of you."

For his activity in coastal restoration, as well as decades of work in a long list of organizations, Milling, 68, has been chosen to receive The Times-Picayune Loving Cup for 2008.

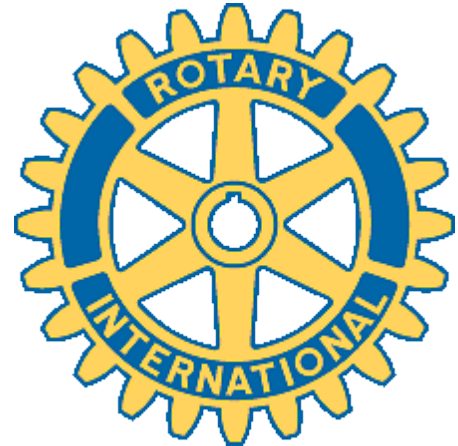
