The food bags are distributed every two weeks. It is our plan to add protein to each distribution. We will offer a different form of protein each time - next time maybe cans of tuna, or ??

So, last week, Rotary donated, through Mardi Gras Zone, 20 cases of vienna sausage!

And I have \$287.00 and several bags of red (and other)

beans to donate for the next distribution!

PRESIDENT'S REMARKS & ANNOUNCEMENTS

August 26, 2009

We cannot let pass this moment without remembering Senator Edward Kennedy, who died today. He and his family were born into a life of privilege, but dedicated themselves to serving others.

This great senator, with his three brothers who died in the service of their country, and their sisters who lived their time serving the less fortunate, left their mark on my generation.

During our growing into adulthood and political awareness, they, perhaps more than any others, helped mold our own sense of duty, public service, and civic morality.

Today I steal and paraphrase a few words from Ted Kennedy's eulogy for his brother Robert, words which I believe are appropriate to us today, because they define a good Rotarian.

Ted Kennedy said:

My brother need not be idealized, or enlarged in death beyond what he was in life, but can be remembered simply as a good and decent man, who saw wrong and tried to right it, saw suffering and tried to heal it, saw war and tried to stop it.

As he said many times, to those he touched and who sought to touch him:

Some men see things as they are and say "why?"

I dream things that never were and say, "why not?"

Rotary Four-Way Test

From the earliest days of the organization, Rotarians were concerned with promoting high ethical standards in their professional lives. One of the world's most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics is The Four-Way Test, which was created in 1932 by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor (who later served as RI president) when he was asked to take charge of a company that was facing bankruptcy. Adopted by Rotary in 1943, The Four-Way Test has been translated into more than a hundred languages and published in thousands of ways.

It asks the following four questions:

"Of the things we think, say or do:

1. Is it the TRUTH?
2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?"

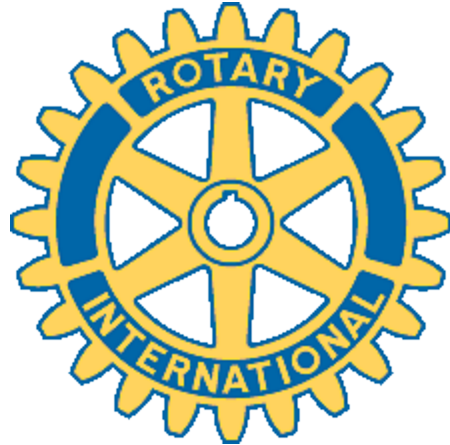
