Some FAQs concerning the Centennial Celebration:

1. Paul Harris Fellows are encouraged to wear their Paul Harris ribbons and pins
2. Dress is standard business attire. Some of our guests are traveling and may not be carrying formal attire, so we did not think it advisable to be more formal. According to dresscodeguide.com, "Business Standard" is the default dress for business. It basically consists of a suit, shirt, tie, jacket for him, and a knee length skirt or suit with a blouse for her. We think cocktail dresses for women will be perfectly fine also for this party.
3. The Patron Party is a cocktail party..all adult beverages and wine will be offered.
4. The Banquet (Dinner Dance) will have only wine. Wine will be passed beginning at 7:30, and will also be served at dinner tables.
5. Antoin's special soufflé potatoes will be passed during both events, and another hors d'oeuvre will be offered at the Patron Party. Several of Antoin's signature appetizers will be served with dinner.
6. Depending on our numbers for the banquet, the band will be ready to play at the 7:30 reception/banquet in the Japanese Room, where the dinner will be served. The Patron Party at 6:30 will be in the Twelfth Night Room. Both rooms are on the second floor. If our numbers exceed about 120, the band may have to be in the Twelfth Night room. We do not expect to have space for a head table, per se. However there will be a podium and microphone, but speeches will be short.
7. Faun is putting together a very classy program brochure that will be a keeper. By the way, it is full of Centennial Minutes.
8. We are informed that Antoin's has 45 spaces in its nearby parking lot. Parking there will be first-come, first served. With Antoin's validation of the parking ticket, parking will cost \$5.00 in that lot.
9. Antoin's has a people elevator for limited use. We have made special arrangements for it to be available to people who need it. See the Maitre D at the restaurant entrance.
10. The special gold Centennial Pin jacket is reminiscent of the City and World-Champion Saints fleur de lis logo, and will be proudly worn by all who own one. Patrons will receive them, and only 100 are being struck. When they are gone, they're gone. Don't you want to be in that number?

Join in Southern Hospitality at 2011 RI Convention in New Orleans The following is a message from our Rotary District:

The 2011 Rotary International Convention will be held in New Orleans. Six Rotary districts in Louisiana, Mississippi, Arkansas and Tennessee are the host districts. Rotarians from the host districts are responsible for planning various events during the convention, including a fellowship event Monday evening.

Host Responsibilities

The evening event on Monday is called Host Hospitality Night. This is an RI convention tradition offering a memorable opportunity for convention registrants to share an evening of hospitality and international fellowship. In 2011, this event will also give us an opportunity to show the world our famous Southern hospitality.

The events on this evening are hosted, sponsored and organized by individual Rotarians or Rotary clubs. The events can be as small or as large, as simple or as extravagant, as the hosts design and can afford. Examples include dinner in the home of a Rotarian or at a local park or attraction hosted jointly by Rotary clubs.

In addition to sponsoring the event, the hosts are responsible for transporting their guests to and from the event. In all, the event should be about 3-4 hours long, including transportation. The cost of the event and transportation are the sole responsibility of the Rotarian and/or Rotary club hosts.

The Monday Evening Host Hospitality subcommittee will assemble the names of the guests as they register. As the event approaches, the subcommittee will assign the guests to the Rotarian and Rotary club hosts and notify these hosts accordingly. The hosts will then contact their guests directly to make logistics

arrangements, including transportation.

Don't Live in New Orleans? No Problem. You can still host an event. Host participation is not limited to Rotarians and Rotary clubs in the New Orleans area. In fact, the participation of many Rotarians from the Rotary districts in Arkansas, Tennessee, Mississippi and Louisiana will be essential to sharing our Southern Hospitality. We are expecting 2,000- 3,000 conventioners to register as guests for this event.

The subcommittee will develop a list of Rotarians and Rotary clubs interested in hosting a Monday Night event. Rotarians and Rotary clubs outside the New Orleans area can contact the subcommittee for a list of New Orleans area Rotarians and Rotary clubs to partner with to host an event.

Call to Action: Sign up to be a host and appoint club liaison Rotary clubs and Rotarians are encouraged to participate as hosts and register interest by filling out the preliminary interest form on the Online Registration page at www.rotary6840.org. Each club is also asked to appoint a club liaison with the Monday Evening Host Hospitality subcommittee. Rotary Four-Way Test

From the earliest days of the organization, Rotarians were concerned with promoting high ethical standards in their professional lives. One of the world's most widely printed and



quoted statements of business ethics is The Four-Way Test, which was created in 1932 by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor (who later served as RI president) when he was asked to take charge of a company that was facing bankruptcy. Adopted by Rotary in 1943, The Four-Way Test has been translated into more than a hundred languages and published in thousands of ways.

It asks the following four questions:
"Of the things we think, say or do:

1. Is it the TRUTH?
2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?"
